What is sexual assault?

"Sexual assault is any type of sexual contact or behavior that occurs without the complicit consent of the recipient." *US Dept. Justice*

This includes:

- Forced sexual intercourse of any kind
- Inappropriate touching or fondling
- Incest
- Rape/Attempted Rape

Sexual assault can be perpetrated by an acquaintance, someone you know well, your spouse, or by a stranger.

What does SANE stand for?

A Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) is a medical provider who has specialized education and clinical preparation in the medical and forensic care of victims of a crime. Other medical providers may also care for you, they are called Sexual Assault Forensic Examiners (SAFE)

SANE/SAFEs are trained to

- identify physical trauma, document injuries, collect evidence, and maintain chain of custody
- provide immediate crisis intervention and emotional support
- collaborate with community agencies in response to crime
- provide expert testimony in a court of law.

Women, men, and children who have experienced sexual assault are in need of specialized care that our SANE/SAFE program can provide.

Sexual assault is **never** the victim's fault - no matter how it happens

Are you a survivor of sexual assault?

This can be one of the most painful, confusing, and frightening things that can happen to a person. The most important thing for you to understand is that it is not your fault. PERIOD!

It is natural to experience feelings, such as anger, disbelief, fear, humilation, shame, restlessness, difficulty concentrating, lack of trust, and guilt. With time and support from our SANE/SAFE team and your loved ones, these feelings can subside.

We are here to support you.

A SANE/SAFE is available 24/7 to respond to your call and take special care of you.

A victim's advocate will be available to provide you with support as needed.



If you have been the victim of a sexual crime

- Get to a safe place then call 911 or go to your nearest emergency room if you sustained injuries
- DO NOT shower, bathe, or change your clothing
- DO NOT eat, smoke, brush teeth or use the bathroom, if possible
- DO NOT clean your home or the area where the assault occured
- DO NOT avoid seeking medical care because of cost. All patients are seen regardless of their ability to pay
- DO call a friend or family member or one of the crisis lines below

- DO bring a change of clothing with you to the exam
- Even if days have passed since your assault, it is still important to have a thorough medical examination and recieve treatment

We undertand it may have been a difficult decision to seek help. But we are glad you did and we will take care of you.



What to expect from a SANE/SAFE exam

- The exam consists of your medical history, your account of the assault, a head-to-toe exam, a genital exam, and forensic evidence collection
- In order to ensure comprehensive care, most exams take 2-3 hours to complete. However, each case is different and exam times may vary.
- The SANE will ask you details of the assault to determine where to look for injury and evidence.
- Your SANE will write down everything you tell them.
- The SANE will perform a pregnancy test (for women) and provide medication to prevent sexually transmitted infections (STIs).
- You have the right to refuse any part of the exam. Be aware that if a SANE does not perform certain steps of the exam, it may be more difficult to prosecute your case in court.
